


There are a lot of things going on in Fonelisco at this moment. Since the beginning of April we have a new Volunteer Michael from Germany, who spend one week with Viola, the former Volunteer, who then returned to our twin town Würzburg. On the Picture you see Michael teaching Helena, who is too young to join the regular school already.



In these days we also had a visit by Zuzka, who stayed here two nights to be informed about the situation of Fonelisco and also to collect selfmade paintings from the kids, which she was going to sell and return the money to our orphanage. Zuzka was here to get more information about the work in Fonelisco in order to tell this to a group of czech students which are at the moment planning the “Help, so we can help” in the Czech Republic. On the 4th of May Michaels girlfriend, Samira, from Schweinfurt arrived to join volunteering at

Fonelisco. We have a new child called Chacha. Though his dramatically past, he is a really friendly and open boy. Our new Volunteers immediately got the feeling that he was a really smart young boy, when teaching him or playing with him, so that they hurried to get him into school. On the picture you see him in the Volunteers office with his new school uniform. Thanks to the donation of a family member of our Volunteers, we were already the next day able to pay his school costs for one year and the following day he could happily joining Primary, even though the semester has already begun.





On the 10th of May, we had a staff meeting in the morning, in which we decided to have a common walk through all the rooms. This was to have a stocktaking of what is needed in the beds and also to have small privately dialogues with all the children in small groups where they could tell us what they got on their heart and what they need, especially for school.

Unfortunately the rooms, were in a pretty bad condition, some beds are damaged, without matrasses or there were no blankets or mosquito nets. Michael and Samira made a list of all this stuff and luckily we can inform you, that there is already a movement to change the situation. They shared out new blankets and installed new mosquito nets, to protect the Fonelisco children save from getting Malaria.



By this way, we also got some bad news. One of our older boys, Paul, was feeling very bad, so that we had to bring him to Hindu Hospital. There we were told that he has Malaria. For 5 days he had to go to hospital, getting injections and now he is feeling good again. Also Msonge, just 2 days later needed to see a doctor. As the small Hindu hospital told us that they have not

the abilities to help, we brought her to the CF. Even though that raised the costs for her treatment, everyone of the Fonelisco family is now really happy that after getting antibiotics against an infection she is now completely healthy again. So that after spending just one day in the Volunteers house, she can now, which was her first wish when feeling better, go back to school.



There were also some problems with unpaid power- and water bills, but by now they seem to be solved, because of money sended by the Fonelesco e.V. in Germany. As in the last months there have always been problems to cover all the costs, they had a pretty long meeting in Germany about to reconstruct many things to keep Fonelesco a nice place for our kids or to make it even better.



In May we also had a visit of a group of church members, who brought food and other donations. We are really thankful for this and also for the spiritual hours we had with them.



On the following picture you see some Indian employees of the mobile phone company Tigo, which surprised us with their visit. They not only brought cookies, juice and lollypops for the kids, they also made the promise that they want to support Fonelesco in future, for example with furniture and anything else.

In the evening of the 17th of May we were shocked by water running out of the tank. Michael and Pius were able to fix it temporary, but it has to be repaired professionally the next days.
